Foster Care-giver (Foster) Responsibilities: Foster Care-givers will be responsible for the general care and feeding of all All Pet Rescue animals placed in their care. This will include, but is not limited to the following:

a. Providing food and water. Food will be provided by All Pet Rescue. The animal must be fed on a regular basis. If a specific diet or feeding routine has been recommended by All Pet Rescue or a veterinarian, this must be followed. Young kittens and puppies may need around-the-clock feedings. You will also be responsible for arranging care for the animal when you are out of town.

b. Administration of oral or topical medications. If medications are ordered by a veterinarian, All Pet Rescue will provide the medication. However, the foster is required to administer it. Some medications must be administered around the clock, or with specific foods, or under very specific circumstances. Instruction on medication administration will be provided to the foster

c. Providing grooming on a regular basis. Long-haired dogs and cats need regular brushing and combing. Cats and kittens need flea combing regularly. Flea bathing or treating All Pet Rescue animals should only be done with All Pet Rescues approval. Young kittens or puppies should NEVER be flea bathed or flea dipped. Use a baby shampoo and a flea comb only to remove fleas.

d. Providing regular exercise for animals in your care. If you have a large dog and a small home, please plan to walk the dog on a leash daily.

e. Keeping dogs in a fenced yard. They should only be allowed out of the yard on a leash and accompanied by you. They must always wear a collar with current identification.

f. Keeping cats as indoor animals. Any outdoor activity must be approved by All Pet Rescue. Litter boxes and litter will be provided by All Pet Rescue.

g. Seeking help for housebreaking and training. Please talk to us if you find that the animal needs training, housebreaking, etc., to become adoptable. All Pet Rescue can help you with these matters if needed.

h. Providing transportation to the animal in your care. All Pet Rescue will pay for spay or neuter services. However, we may need you to transport the animal to and from the veterinarian. We also ask you to provide transportation to our temporary adoption sites in the community where the animal will be shown to facilitate adoption. You will not be required to stay there with the animal. You may be asked to pick him/her up at a specified time.

i. Allowing visitation-approved applicants in your home. Some animals do not do well in group settings. We may, at times, ask you to allow a potential, approved adopter to visit the animal in your home.

j. Contacting All Pet Rescue for medical help. Veterinary care and related costs must be approved by All Pet Rescue in advance and will be paid by All Pet Rescue unless the medical need is due to your negligence. Contact All Pet Rescue immediately if a medical need arises. In case of an emergency, when nobody from All Pet Rescue can be reached, please seek life-saving care immediately while continuing to try to contact All Pet Rescue.

k. Completing and signing a Foster Application and Agreement. Your foster commitment may be as long as six months or as short as one day. Your foster animal may be adopted out and returned to us later. If that occurs, we may ask you to foster this animal again, since the animal is most familiar with you and your household.

l. Making other arrangements. All Pet Rescue animals are solely All Pet Rescue's. You may not co-foster or give away an All Pet Rescue animal without our express approval. All

adoptions must be approved by All Pet Rescue. If you cannot care for the animal, contact All Pet Rescue immediately, so that other arrangements can be made.

m. Maintaining a safe environment. Your home should be large enough to accommodate the animal you intend to foster. You should have an area in which you can, at least temporarily, isolate the All Pet Rescue animal from your own. Before you become a foster, you should be certain that your animals are up to date on all their shots and that they have been spayed or neutered. Your foster animal may have parasites (ring-worm, tapeworm, hookworm, coccidiosis, giardiasis) and we cannot be responsible if this is transmitted to your pets. We want all the animals to be safe, so please take precautions as you deem necessary. We may visit your home to inspect the area you have available for the All Pet Rescue animal.

n. Contacting All Pet Rescue. When you receive your foster animal, you will be provided with the names and phone numbers of your primary contacts at All Pet Rescue Use these for all issues, including veterinary care relating to your foster animal.

o. Completing a biography. Please be observant of your All Pet Rescue animal's habits, likes and dislikes. So that we can find just the right home for your foster animal, we need to know as much as possible. Notice how s/he gets along with people of all ages, any animals s/he may live with or encounter, whether s/he is a touchy-feely or hands off type, indoor or outdoor lover, quiet or talkative.

p. Providing loving care. As a foster care-giver you have taken on a labor of love in providing needed care until a permanent home can be found. Your kindness and attention to the animal will help facilitate adoption and is much appreciated by your foster animal as well as by All Pet Rescue.
